


Richard's Early Years

Richard was born at Fotheringhay, Northamptonshire on 2 October 1452 into the House of York. He was the youngest child and fourth son. His brother Edward won the throne at the battle of Towton in 1461 and became Edward IV.

Edward married Elizabeth
Woodville, a Lancastrian widow
in 1464. Legend has it that they
met under an oak tree at
Grafton Regis and married in
secret. They had many children
including Edward and Richard
who became the ill-fated
'Princes in the Tower'.
Unfortunately the meteoric rise
of the new Queen's family,
the Woodvilles, upset many of
Edward's existing supporters.

Little is known of Richard's early life. He was still a child when his brother became King, but we know that before he was 20 he had played a major role in putting down a coup to depose Edward. This was staged by their brother George, Duke of Clarence and the Earl of Warwick. He accompanied Edward in exile to continental Europe and took park in the major battles of Barnet and Tewkesbury in 1471 which restored his brother to the throne.
